Dear Parent/ Carer

From the 1 September 2017 you can apply for a secondary school place for your child and you must do this by 31 October 2017

This information is for families living in North Yorkshire who have a child born between 1 September 2006 and 31 August 2007 who is due to transfer from primary to secondary school in September 2018.

Families living outside North Yorkshire will need to contact their home authority to obtain the information regarding school admissions and make an application to the Authority where they live

You will be able to apply for a secondary school place from **1 September 2017** and all the information on how to apply will be available at www.northyorks.gov.uk/admissions including:

- the criteria used by the authority to allocate school places;
- arrangements for the admission of pupils to secondary schools, including where there are exceptional social or medical reasons why your child should be given consideration for allocation to a particular school;
- details of arrangements that apply to particular schools in your area;
- eligibility for home-to-school transport;
- **The online parent portal where you will be able to create an account and apply online for a school place.**

It is important that you read all of the information on the school admissions and transport pages before completing the online common application form.

Online applications - you will need to

- create an account (you will receive a verification registration email)
- log back into your account to add your school preferences and other details.
- submit your application (you will receive an email acknowledgement to confirm we have received your application)

Please note if you amend your preferences at any time before your form has been received by the authority you must remember to review and submit it. Also think carefully before you submit your preferences as you will not be able to change them online once you have submitted your application.

If you wish to make changes after you have submitted your application you will need to complete a 'Change to submitted school application form' this will be available at www.northyorks.gov.uk/admissions and return this direct to us (see contact overleaf).

Paper applications - if you do not have internet access, you can request a copy of the information for parents and a paper copy of the common application form, contact details overleaf.

The deadline for receiving an application for a school place for September 2018 is no later than 31 October 2017.

Late applications - any application received after the 31 October will be considered late unless you provide a genuine reason. Late applications are dealt with after those received on time and this could affect the allocation of your child's school place, for more details see www.northyorks.gov.uk/lateapplications. Reasons for a late application need to be put in writing via email see contact details below.

National Offer Day - confirmation of the school place allocated to your child will be sent to you on 1 March 2018. If you apply online you will be notified by email or you will be able to log back into your account and view the school place that has been 'offered'. If you complete a paper application allocation letters will be sent out by second class post on 1 March 2018 and these may take up to 3-5 days to arrive. We are not able to advise anyone of their child's school place over the telephone.

If we are unable to allocate a place at your preferred school, you will be entitled to an appeal in line with current legislation. Appeal forms are available on the website at www.northyorks.gov.uk/admission_appeals or by contacting the Admissions Team on 01609 533679.

Should you need more information about individual schools before completing an application, a prospectus can be obtained direct from the school concerned. Please check the information on the website carefully as some denominational schools require the completion of a **Supplementary Information Form (SIF)** to enable them to assess your application against the school's admission policy. Failure to submit a SIF will result in your application being considered after all other applications where a SIF has been provided. A SIF is not an application for a school place and you will still need to apply.

You must complete a CAF regardless of the type of school you are applying for (academy, community, aided, trust or foundation) or where it is. This will enable us to allocate a school place to your child in accordance with our agreed scheme for coordinated admissions.

If you want a place at a school in another Authority's area, you must list this on the NYCC common application form and we will liaise with that Authority.

We strongly recommend that you list the normal school for your home address as one of your preferences, in case the school you want cannot offer your child a place.

You should keep all correspondence you receive, including emails and acknowledgements, as you might need these should you wish to appeal if we are not able to allocate your child a place at your preferred school.
